Similar cults also exist in today's Church. One can use the experiences and decisions of the early churches as a mirror. • The conversion of Paul The authentic Gospel is revealed by Jesus directly to the Apostles. It is then passed down by the Apostles or those who had direct contact with them either verbally or through their teachings and letters. It has been faithfully preserved in the Church through apostolic succession. We call the truth revealed by God and handed down to us in the said manner the "Holy Tradition". Therefore, the complete truth can be found only under the direction of the Church's Magisterium and interpretation of Scripture within the "Holy Tradition".
