C	<p><u>The Woman</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The woman who will face the Serpent in Scripture • St. Justin: Jesus must be born of the Virgin Mary so that the sin of disobedience that comes from the Serpent will be eradicated in the same way. • “The deadlock of Eve’s disobedience will be unraveled by Mary’s obedience. The restraints of Eve that come from her lack of faith will be unraveled by Mary’s faith. • Adam and Eve are the parents of the human family; the new Adam and Eve are the parents of the new human family. 	<p>Rev 12:3-6, 9, 13-18 B. D	<p><u>Adam</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Was Adam present when the Serpent tempted Eve? Why didn’t he guard the Garden and protect Eve? • What should Adam have done in this situation? • The Serpent’s attack on Eve symbolizes Satan’s attack on motherhood. He uses the same tactics in today’s world, too. • The first sin of humanity is their resistance against God and their faithlessness. E	<p><u>The Temptation</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Serpent encourages human beings to detach themselves from God’s dominion and seek for independence and freedom. They fail to rely on God to distinguish good from evil. However, “the fulfillment of man’s freedom lies in his acceptance of God’s law”.
