E.	Why would Jesus choose the Feast of Tabernacles to reveal himself as the Spring of Living Water? □ The Feast of Tabernacles commemorates the erection of the Temple. Temple = The Mystical Body of Jesus => Incarnation of Jesus, the Word made flesh who "tabernacled" among us in the "tent" of his body (Temple, Church, Mystical Body). □ The Feast of Tabernacles commemorates the event in Exodus, Moses strikes the rock and water flows from it to quench Israel's thirst. This rock is Jesus, from whom flows the living water that gives life. □ Ezekiel's vision of the restored Temple (water gushing out from it into all directions) prefigures the above teaching. F.	Jesus' Mercy on the Woman Caught in Adultery as a Revelation of His Wisdom □ Under the Roman Occupation, Jews do not have the authority to inflict death penalty. If Jesus agrees with the Elders that the adulterous woman should be stoned, then Jesus would be guilty of insurrection. □ She should be stoned according to the law of Moses.
