

<b>A</b>	<p><b><u>The Psalms: A Question of Authorship</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Psalms often refer to someone who is like David, “the anointed one”, a “Davidic King”. From the perspective of OT (CCC 129), we believe that this person prefigures Jesus who is the son of David, the eternal King.</li> <li>Many psalms talk about the Davidic kingship in a way anticipatory of the future.</li> <li>The two priestly lines mentioned in scripture: the order of Levi or Aaron as set forth in the Mosaic Law, and the priestly kings of Jerusalem: Melchizedek, David, and Jesus.</li> </ul>	<p>QS5p33 Ps 2,72,110</p> <p>David p 170 PS 45-72</p> <p>David p 94 Gen 14:18-20 Ps 110:2,4 Heb 5:5</p>
<b>B</b>	<p><b><u>The Four Historical Figures Before David’s Coronation</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Ruth, Moabite woman, “your people shall be my people, and your God my God” (Ruth 1:16) =&gt; the conversion of the Gentiles and the universal Catholic Church; relationship with Boaz =&gt; Jesus/Church. “Call me no longer Naomi, call me Mara, for the Almighty has dealt bitterly with me” (Ruth 1:20). Mary the Sorrowful Mother is the ancestor of Jesus and David according to the Gospel of Matthew’s genealogy of Jesus.</li> <li>Hannah – There are five unusual stories of birth in the bible: Isaac (Sarah), Moses (Jochebed), Samuel (Hannah), John the Baptist (Elizabeth), Jesus (Mary) =&gt; promised by God; Hannah’s canticle and the Magnificat.</li> <li>Samuel – “Here I am! (1Sam 3:4) =&gt; “Here I am!” (Ps 40:7-8)</li> <li>Saul</li> </ul>	<p>David p 9-13</p> <p>David p 12</p> <p>David p 17, 20</p> <p>David p 20 1Sam 9-15</p>
